Please note: <u>These rooms will NOT be opening in the weekends</u>. For any urgent collects required on weekends, your patients are asked to visit the main reception at Tauranga hospital and the on-call service will be contacted.

**Domiciliary Home Visits -** This service has been suspended until further notice. **Courier Services -** Unless otherwise notified, Pathlab's current courier service to your practice will continue.

## **Reduction in Laboratory Requests**

We ask all clinicians to immediately reconsider or reduce the frequency of laboratory tests that are nonessential, discretionary, routine or can be delayed.

FNAs, bone marrows and skin allergies will require pre-approval by a pathologist and will be restricted to only where absolutely clinically necessary.

This is an evolving situation and further notifications may follow.
